Regional Wins from Cap-to-Cap 2021

- The Air Quality Team learned that forest management and wildfire investments to treat forests and protect our air is a priority funding area of the Build Back Better agenda.
- The Water Resources Team learned that a renewed Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) has been added to the U.S. Senate's 2022 legislative calendar, meaning proposed water resources solutions are a priority for 2022.
- One week after the conclusion of Cap-to-Cap, the Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill was passed through both houses of Congress. This bill will invest billions of dollars into California's infrastructure, including \$25.3 billion for highways, \$9.45 billion for public transportation, \$384 million for EV charging stations and more.

Cap-to-Cap is fueled by the greatness of our region and the unique perspectives each of our delegates bring to the fabric of our economy. The proposals that are discussed at Cap-to-Cap year after year continue to define policy greatness and ensure the the long term needs of our community and our relentless drive to protect our economic health, well-being, and quality of life.
